

# FULL DAY WORKSHOPS AT LEICESTER QUAKER MEETING HOUSE



**TIMES:** 10.30 am - 4.00 pm. Doors open from 10.00 am.

**REFRESHMENTS:** Hot drinks, biscuits and fruit are available during the breaks. Tap water will be available all day. Bring a small amount of food to share for lunch. (or bring your own if you prefer).

**ADDRESS:** 16 Queen's Road, Leicester LE2 IWP. NB. Entry is at the rear of the building.

## GETTING THERE:

### BY PUBLIC TRANSPORT:

Leicester Railway Station is about 1 mile from the Meeting House and is a pleasant 20 minute walk.

Alternatively there are buses about every 15 minutes from just outside the station (services: 44, 80 and 80a). Alight at the first stop in Queen's Road, just after the Meeting House.

If you arrive at Leicester Coach Station, you can catch the 40, 80 or 80a from Charles Street, a few minutes walk away.

### BY ROAD:

From M1 (J21) and M69:

Follow: 'A563 Ring Road, Leicester South and East' for about 4 miles.

At the A6 roundabout, take the first exit towards the City Centre and continue for about 2 miles.

At the next roundabout, take the first exit - Victoria Park Road.

Take the second turning left at the traffic lights, onto Queens Road.

Leicester Quaker Meeting House is immediately on your left.

### BICYCLES:

There is a bicycle rack in the car park.

Please don't bring bikes onto the patio or into the Meeting House.

### PARKING:

There is a small, shared car park at the rear of the Building, with space for some of the Singing for Larks participants, but not all. If you need to park here for mobility reasons, contact Faith ([singingforlarks@gmail.com](mailto:singingforlarks@gmail.com)) at least 2 days before the event.

Please don't park in the 6 Drayton House spaces and don't block in any cars – they may not be at the same workshop.

On Queen's Road itself, parking is restricted to 60 minutes. Parking without a time limit is available on Victoria Park Road and on Knighton Park Road, and there is a public car park on the other side of Victoria Park, near the De Montfort Hall.
